November 9th, 2017

On November 9th, 2017 at 08:30am officers of the Gananoque Police Service conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle. As a result of the traffic stop and speaking with the driver of the motor vehicle, officers requested the driver provide a breath sample into an approved screening device. The driver registered a “fail” on the device and was arrested for operating a motor vehicle with over 80 mgs of alcohol.

The driver was transported to the Gananoque Police Service where the driver provided two samples of breath into an approved instrument.

A 51-year-old female from Gananoque was charged with operating a motor vehicle with over 80 mgs of alcohol. The female was released to appear in court at a later date.

The female’s drivers licence was automatically suspended for 90 days. The vehicle was seized and impounded for seven days, with the accused being responsible for all fees and fines.

November 13th, 2017

In the early morning hours of November 13th, 2017 officers of the Gananoque Police Service conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle. As a result of the traffic stop a 31-year-old female from Kingston was arrested for drug possession. Pursuant to arrest police searched the motor vehicle and located a quantity of illegal drugs, drug paraphernalia and a canister of pepper spray. The female is currently before the courts on an undertaking before an officer in charge and on probation. The female was held in custody pending a show cause hearing.

The charges include;

Possession for the purpose of trafficking 5(2) CDSA – 2 counts

Possession of substance 4(1) CDSA

Unauthorized possession of a weapon 91(2) CC

Knowledge of unauthorized possession of a weapon 92(2) CC

Carry concealed prohibited device 90 CC

Possession of weapon for dangerous purpose 88 CC

Fail to comply with probation 733.1 (1) CC

Fail to comply with undertaking 145(5.1) CC
