### August 1, 2020

On August 1st, 2020 Gananoque Police Service received a call-in relation to a male who was currently bound by the court on several domestic related charges. The male was bound by conditions of his release to have no direct/indirect contact with the victims. Officers located the 83-year-old male from Gananoque and he was arrested and charged with failing to comply with conditions of his release order. The male was held in custody pending a bail hearing.

### August 5, 2020

On August 5, 2020 at 8:45PM officers with the Gananoque Police responded to a local hotel for a reported ongoing dispute in one of the rooms. Upon officer's arrival the room had significant damage and it was determined a male, female and young child had occupied the room. The male had fled the area upon officer's arrival. After further investigation it was determined an altercation occurred between the male and female, resulting in the female causing facial lacerations to the male's face with a broken glass. The male attended Kingston General Hospital for treatment. The 25-year-old female from Battersea was located, arrested and charged with Assault cause bodily harm and mischief and will appear in court to answer to the charges.

### August 6, 2020

On August 6, 2020, The Gananoque Police Service attended a local hotel for a medical call to assist Emergency Medical Services with patient who was exhibiting no vital signs. Officers attended and determined the patient was experiencing overdose related symptoms. Upon responding the Gananoque Police Service successfully administered Narcan to the unconscious and unresponsive patient. The patient become alert and was transported to Kingston General Hospital for further medical treatment.

Narcan (naloxone) is an **opioid** antagonist used for the complete or partial reversal of **opioid overdose**, including respiratory depression.

The Gananoque Police Service deployed Narcan as part of their opioid response strategy and started carrying Narcan as standard equipment in 2017.

### August 8/9, 2020

On August 8<sup>th</sup> and 9<sup>th</sup>, 2020 Gananoque Police Service continued the designated targeted patrols of Joel Stone Park, Oak Street Park, Town Park and Steel Street Park in response to ongoing complaints received. This included scheduled staffed shifts at the parks, utilizing Special Constables.

In total 12 people were cautioned for Liquor License Act offences, 11 people were cautioned under the Smoke Free Ontario Act and 2 charges were laid under the Liquor License Act. Gananoque Police Service and community stakeholders are continuing to work together to ensure the park is a safe environment that can be enjoyed by families, youth, adults, locals and tourists alike.
