

Busy Friday For Gan-Police

On Friday, December 11, 2020, Gananoque Police located and arrested a local Gananoque man, who had been wanted for various breaches of his Probation Order. The male was processed and released from the Gananoque Police Station with a court date scheduled for January 2021.

On the afternoon of December 11, 2020, Gananoque Police Officers conducting routine patrol received an Automated Licence Plate Recognition (ALPR) notification of a possible suspended driver. A subsequent traffic stop revealed that the male drive driver, a resident of Belleville, Ontario, was in fact suspended and was also breaching conditions of multiple court issued Release Orders. Police arrested the male, later releasing him on an Appearance Notice as well as a Provincial Summons with a court date in late January 2021.

On the evening of December 11, 2020, Gananoque Police were conducting a R.I.D.E check at the north end of Stone Street North, when a vehicle intentionally sped through the check point, forcing officers out of the roadway. The driver led police on a vehicle pursuit that continued onto Highway 401 where the driver finally pulled over. A local Gananoque man was identified as the lone vehicle driver and he was arrested and charged criminally for flight from police, dangerous operation of a conveyance, breach of probation, as well as driving while suspended. His vehicle was seized for 45 days as per the Vehicle Impoundment Program (VIP) authority, and he was later released on an Undertaking as well as a Provincial Summons to appear in court in late January 2021 to answer to all charges.
